Background from Indiana Economic Development Corporation:

Greenville Technology, Inc. (GTI), which designs and manufactures a variety of interior and exterior components for the automobile industry, will invest \$21.37 million to construct and equip an injection molding and assembly facility on a 25-acre parcel in Anderson's Flagship Certified Technology Park. The company expects to start construction on the 150,000 square-foot plant this month and plans to begin production in January 2013. The new facility is

projected to produce 500,000 finished goods by the end of its first year of operations.
